

2015 Youth Peace Camp

● Eligibility:

- Korean War veterans' grandchildren who are attending universities or colleges (including graduate schools) with GPA 2.5 or higher, no criminal records, recommended by Head of University, dean, professor, etc.
- Those who have not visited Korea before by the Korean government's invitation
 - * To apply to this camp, all students should be able to communicate in English, and submit Essay about Korea or the Korean War or the KW Veterans.

● Time Table & Number of Participants:

- Camp 1 : June 22(Mon) ~ June 28(Sun), 2015 (7 days & 6 nights)
- Camp 2 : July 23(Thu) ~ July 29(Wen), 2015(7 days & 6 nights)

 - * Grandchildren of Korean War veterans from 21 UN allied nations which dispatched military troops and medical support to Korea during the Korean War
